Lenten Living and Tips

Feast

Prepare a seder meal and celebrate the Passover as Jesus and his disciples did at the Last Supper. It's a good way to relive Jesus' final hours before his crucifixion.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards for Good Friday.

Gospel at the Procession with Palms — Jesus' entry into Jerusalem (Luke 19:28-40).

First Reading — In spite of my sufferings I am not disgraced. I am not put to shame (Isaiah 50:4-7).
