October 29, 2023 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

GOD'S LAW AND GOD'S LOVE

The secret to our Sunday readings today lies in the Gospel Acclamation: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord, and my Father will love him and we will come to him" (John 14:23). That single line from John's Gospel gets right to the heart of today's readings, reminding us of the intimate relationship between the law ("keeping God's word") and God's love. While human nature tends to resist burdensome rules, our readings show us the wisdom of God's plan that guides us with the rule of law. In Exodus, the law boldly prevents injustice, protecting the most vulnerable members of society. In Thessalonians, the law elevates our behavior and saves us from "the coming wrath." In Matthew's Gospel, the law swaddles us in God's compassion. In loving God, neighbor, and self, we imitate God and bring blessing to a fractured world.

Day of the Dead (All Souls Day - November 2)

During the month of October, Mexico and other Latin American countries prepare for the celebration of All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2). In these countries, these two feasts are a mixture of ancient Christian rites and Meso-American devotions. They assert that death is a natural part of the cycle of life and that the deceased are not forgotten by their loved ones. This is the basis of the Catholic devotion to the saints: God is God of the living and not the dead (Matthew 22:32).

At the end of October and the beginning of November, families spend time in the cemetery, visiting the graves of their relatives and friends, washing the headstones, placing bouquets of marigolds, and lighting candles. This custom is similar to that of the Christian Romans who did the same with the tombs of martyrs and relatives in the catacombs.

Often we cannot go back to the graves of our loved ones, so the custom of the altars of the dead has become important in our churches and homes. Many Latinos construct and adorn small altars and dedicate them to the souls of their loved ones who have died. On the altars are found decorated colored paper, photographs of the deceased, religious articles, food, drink, and other things that the deceased enjoyed during their lives. These altars are testimony to the fact that deceased Christians do not forget us and we do not forget them either. The love of God unites us forever.
